NURS 216 - Pathophysiology and Pharmacology II

★3 The course explores selected episodic and chronic health alterations and the related pharmacological concepts. The focus is on applying foundational knowledge of pathophysiology and pharmacology to evidence-informed nursing practice. Aligns with concepts from NURS/SC INF 220 and NURS/SC INF 221 intentional clinical learning activities. Note: Available only to nursing students in the Collaborative/Honors Program and Bilingual Program. Prerequisite for Collaborative/Honors Program students: NURS 116 (or NURS 113). Prerequisite for Bilingual Program students: PHYSE 152. Students must achieve a minimum grade of C+ in order to progress in the program. Credit may be obtained for only one of NURS 216 or 215.

Course Learning Outcomes

Upon completion of this course, the student will be able to:

- 1. Link knowledge of anatomy and physiology to pathophysiological and pharmacotherapeutic concepts.
- 2. Demonstrate theoretical understanding of pathophysiology as it relates to changes in health status.
- 3. Demonstrate theoretical understanding of pharmacokinetic and pharmacodynamic principles in pharmacotherapeutics.
- 4. Describe the pharmacotherapeutic classification, mechanism of action, properties, and effects of drugs.
- 5. Explain the relationship between pathophysiological concepts and pharmacotherapeutic concepts at a novice level.
- 6. Apply the pathophysiology and pharmacotherapeutic concepts to focused non-complex clinical examples at a novice level.
- 7. Identify the nursing implications in relation to pathophysiology and pharmacotherapeutics at a novice level.
- 8. Predict common trajectories for pathophysiological processes and pharmacotherapeutic treatments at a novice level.

Assignments Descriptions

1) In-class quizzes (15%)

There are 6 quizzes each with 20-25 questions that cover the lectures prior to the quiz. **See class weekly schedule for quiz dates**. The total category is worth 15%, with each quiz equating to 2% except for quiz 4 which is worth 5%. Quizzes are open book and will open on the day indicated on the weekly schedule and will close at midnight on October 8th for 216A & December 3rd for 216B.

2) Mastery Assessments & HESI Reviews (25%):

Mastery Assessments must be completed in order to receive the marks. There is a mastery assessment that must be completed for each concept. These are worth 2% each. These assessments can be found in the Nursing Concepts Online Course of your Elsevier Package under the N216 course folder. (PASSWORD: 216). You <u>must</u> reach mastery level one to obtain marks. There are two HESI reviews as indicated in the weekly schedule that are worth a total of 5%.

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3) Midterm Examination (25%):

75 questions. Covers all material discussed on the following topics: fluid & electrolytes, anxiety, mood & affect, intracranial regulation, & cognition. Respondus Lockdown Browser will be used.

4) Final Examination (30%):

100 questions. Covers all course material. Details will be announced in advance. Registrar's office scheduling date, time, and exam location. Time limitation is strictly applied. Respondus Lockdown Browser will be used.

Using LockDown Browser and Respondus for Online Exams

This course requires the use of LockDown Browser for online exams. Watch this <u>short video</u> to get a basic understanding of LockDown Browser and the optional webcam feature (which may be required for some exams).

- Before starting the test, know how much time is available for it, and that you've allotted sufficient time to complete it

- Remain at your desk or workstation for the duration of the test
- LockDown Browser will prevent you from accessing other websites or applications; you will be unable to exit the test until all questions are completed and submitted
- Do not click on any links that may appear in questions as it will terminate the exam.

Final grades

The assignments are marked as raw scores according to the percentage weight assigned to each. The marks on course assignments will contribute to the overall letter grade according to the percentage that each assignment is weighted in the course. At the end of the course, all assignment scores are totaled for a term summary mark in the course based on the grading scale below. The FINAL COURSE GRADE is based on the cumulative total of individual student's weighted assignment marks.
