**ENGL 010 F Course Description:**

This is a course that will allow students to review grammar, the mechanics of sentence and paragraph writing. The basic terminology used to analyse literature, and the study of various forms of literature will be examined.

Students will develop the skills to examine and comment on the various forms of poetry.

**Course Outcomes:**

This course will allow students to learn more about the parts of speech, grammar, sentence structure and paragraph writing through hands-on activities and writing assignments. The writing process will be studied by working on various grammatical skills and paragraph writing. By the end of this course, you will be able to write well-structured paragraphs and will be prepared to move on to essay writing.

Through study of various forms of poetry, drama and a Shakespearean play, students will examine, analyze and discuss the various forms of literature.

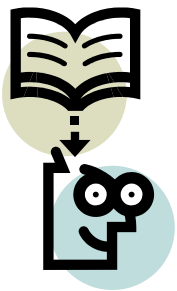
