Course Description:

Welcome to English 33F. In this class, we will explore a variety of essays, short stories, a novel, poetry and a Shakespearean play. A brief review of grammar, punctuation, and sentence structure will begin the course. After these are reviewed, paragraph structure will be examined. We will be writing about what we are studying. The goal is to become able to read and comment on a variety of literature. The format of a research essay will be studied. Students will complete a formal essay based on personal interest.

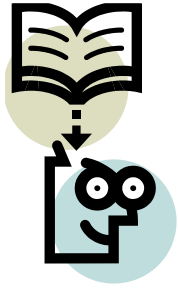
