Assignments Descriptions

1) Weekly Quizzes: These will be completed in your Evolve platform under the N106 tab within the resources for the Patton et al. Anatomy and Physiology textbook.

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- 2) Midterm: Covers all material discussed up to the date of the midterm (Units 1-3 or Chapters 1-26). It will be comprised of 100 questions and will be a variety of multiple choice, fill in the blank, labelling. It will be done online using Respondus Lockdown Browser
- **3)** Final Exam: Covers all course material. It will be comprised of 100 questions and will be a variety of multiple choice, fill in the blank, labelling. Details will be announced in advance via the final exam schedule set out by the Registrar's Office (scheduling date, time, and exam location). Time limitation is strictly applied. The exam will be completed using the Respondus LockDown Browser as it will be in an electronic format.

Using LockDown Browser and Respondus for Online Exams
