ACP 507, Physical Examination

3 Credits, 45 hours lecture

Course Description

This course focuses on techniques for carrying out physical examinations, gathering patient histories, interviewing patients, recognizing signs and symptoms, and assessing physical, mental, and emotional health status.

- 2. Discuss and perform organized comprehensive physical examinations using a systematic approach for all body systems.
- 3. Differentiate normal from abnormal assessment findings relative to differences in age, sex, and condition(s).
- 4. Discuss and perform accurate history taking and interview approaches for all body systems.
- 5. Perform accurate vital signs and discuss normal and abnormal findings relative to age, sex, and condition(s).
- 6. Discuss and perform accurate reporting and documentation.
