ACP 502 – Pathophysiology

6 credits, average two 3-hour classes per week over 15 weeks

Course Description

This course will provide an understanding of human pathophysiology at the cellular, organ, and systems level. Pathophysiology, the deviations from normal anatomy (structure) and physiology (function) altered by disease and/or injury, will cover systems concurrently with ACP 501 – Anatomy and Physiology. Developing a strong foundation of pathophysiology knowledge is critical to guiding Advanced Care Paramedic (ACP) practice such as critical thinking, differential diagnoses, assessments, histories, and treatments.

Course Outcomes

Upon successful completion of the course the student will:

- Apply foundational principles of normal human anatomy and physiology to pathophysiological processes.
- Understand that pathophysiology is the systematic study of the functional changes in cells, tissues, and
 organs altered by disease and/or injury.
- Identify and discuss etiology, mechanisms, clinical manifestations, and complications of pathophysiological processes for various systems across the lifespan.
- Utilize research provided to guide evidence-based knowledge and practice.
- Perform high fidelity simulation (HFS) during tech weeks to enhance knowledge and praxis.

Evaluation

- Students must achieve a minimum of **B grade** for total course grade to progress.
- Midterm and Final Exams require <u>mandatory attendance</u>. Absences will require prior approval.
