Tips for True and False

- Notice words that are absolutes: *all, every, never, no* = usually false
- Notice the relationship between ALL parts of the sentence = a statement is only true if ALL parts are true
- Underline the negatives = *not, cannot, do not, no, in – (incomplete), un – (unimportant)*
- If the statement has 2 negatives, cross them both out
- Example: we will ~~not~~ ski if it does ~~not~~ snow
- Stick with one letter for guessing if there is no penalty for guessing
