During your first week at Keyano College the Childhood Studies faculty will give instructions on the childhood studies student information page on Moodle on how to register and pay for the required course.

When enrolled in the Childhood Studies practicum course a police reference check with vulnerable sector dated no earlier than middle of December must be submitted to the Childhood Studies faculty. Also required is the completion of signed practicum policies that will be available to students during the first week of class.



Additionally, a current Intervention Record Check is also a requirement. ^{heckForm_051120.pd} Please email the completed CS 2687 form along with two pieces of identification to <u>CS-</u> <u>IRCrequest@gov.ab.ca</u>. Once received, please submit the completed check to the Childhood Studies faculty.

Students can register up to and including the first day of class, however, it is recommended that as soon as the conditional acceptance is offered, that you register into the program as courses are filled on a first come, first served basis.
