BEd Elementary Course Options for the first 60 credits – Year 1 and 2 (Years 3 & 4 at Keyano in Collaborative Degree as U of A student, or transfer to another institution)

Each course can only be used once to satisfy **ONE** of the required elements (e.g. HIST 260 cannot be used for both Canadian history and a social science.)

Multi-Part Courses are indicated with a red + on the program of study table. If your course includes a lecture, laboratory, tutorial, clinical, or practicum, please register for ALL required parts, and choose matching section codes.

For example:

- BUS111 lecture A **and** laboratory AL1
- CHEM101 lecture A, laboratory X, **and** tutorial V
- CHEM101 lecture B, laboratory Y, **and** tutorial V2

The number of credits required to reach Full Time status can vary based on the total number of credits in the year of study of your program.

- Students can only be Part Time in Spring in most programs.

All 60 credits of the first two years must be completed by the end of April of the year in which you plan to begin Year 3. Intakes into year 3 take place every second year in odd-numbered years. The next intake into year 3 is Fall 2027, and the next year after that will be Fall 2029.

NOTE: University of Alberta is introducing Major and Minor studies into this collaborative degree program effective the Fall 2029 intake into Year 3. Affected students will be notified if their schedules will need to be adjusted to accommodate this change.

You may reduce your course load and do fewer courses per term, but it will take you longer than four terms to graduate and you will incur additional costs.

Repeating Courses: Please review the [repeating courses policy](#), as there is a limit to the number of times you can repeat courses.

Once you have registered for classes, **you are responsible for the associated tuition and fees whether you attend or not**, unless you have withdrawn.
