The number of credits required to reach Full Time status can vary based on the total number of credits in the year of study of your program.

- Full Time status in this program is 9 credits (three 3-credit courses)
- Students can only be Part Time in Spring in most programs.

Elective Requirements:

Students must successfully complete 60 credits (twenty 3-credit course):

- Seven required courses
- Seven Core Electives (listed below)
- Six Open Electives
- Optional Work Integrated Learning (not required to graduate)

Core Electives (Choose at least seven):

- ENGL 221 Reading Politics: Class and Ideology (prerequisite is 6 credits in Junior English)
- ENGL 223 Reading Politics: Empire and the Postcolonial (prerequisite is 6 credits in Junior English)
- HIST 260 Intro to Canadian History 1500 - 1867
- HIST 261 Intro to Canadian History 1867 to the Present
- MEDIA 210 Contemporary Media Culture
- PHIL 217 Biology, Society & Values
- PHIL 270 Introduction to Political Philosophy
- PHIL 386 Philosophy of Health Care
- POLSC 201 History of Political Thought
- POLSC 211 History of Political Theory
- POLSC 221 Canadian Government
- SOCY 260 Inequality & Social Stratification (SOCY100 is a prerequisite)

Open Electives (Choose at least six):

These can be literally any 3-credit university courses that:

- You have the prerequisites for
- Will fit into your schedule without a time conflict
- Is not restricted to specific programs, such as NURS or ENGG courses

Graduation Requirements: Students with a passing grade in each course, who successfully complete the program of study and obtain an overall program Grade Point Average (GPA) of 1.7 or better shall be issued a credential. **Too many grades of D may impact your eligibility to graduate.**

You may reduce your course load and do fewer courses per term, but it will take you longer than four terms to graduate and you will incur additional costs.

Repeating Courses: Please review the [repeating courses policy](#), as there is a limit to the number of times you can repeat courses.

Once you have registered for classes, **you are responsible for the associated tuition and fees whether you attend or not**, unless you have withdrawn.

PLEASE NOTE: **Non-attendance is not accepted as a notice of withdrawal.**
