Students must have an average of at least 60% in five appropriate subjects including English 30-1, and a mark of at least 50% in all subjects. Official Transcripts from all secondary and post-secondary educational institutions that the student has attended are required.

Post-Graduate Work Permit Program (PGWP)

The Post-Graduation Work Permit (PGWP) Program enables students who have successfully graduated from eligible Canadian designated learning institutions (DLIs) to obtain an open work permit to gain invaluable Canadian work experience. This real-world training acquired through the program plays a crucial role in helping new graduates meet the work experience criteria for various permanent residency programs in Canada. The length of the Post-Graduation Work Permit is typically determined based on the duration of the student's program of study for international students.

- At least 8 months and less than 2 years (example: certificate programs):
 Up to one year PGWP
- 2 years or longer (example: diploma and bachelor's programs):

Three years PGWP

Pathways to permanent residency

Upon graduation, international students have a multitude of pathways to explore for obtaining permanent residency in Canada. Some of the most common and promising options include Canadian Express Class and other Canadian Express Entry Programs, Provincial Nominee Programs for Alberta, and Workforce Immigration and Support Program for Fort McMurray Residents/Workers.

Alberta Advantage Immigration Programs (AAIP)

The Alberta Immigrant Nominee Program (AINP) is an important economic immigration initiative that aims to nominate individuals intending to settle in Alberta for permanent residency.
