* You will be registered into your Coop work placement by the WIL Coordinator once your placement is confirmed. Students without confirmed coop work terms two weeks after the classroom course end date will not be enrolled in PECO 3500.

If you were accepted into the **Fall 2026** intake, please register for Fall 2026 courses. Your steam time will take place in Winter or Summer 2027.

If you were accepted into the **Winter 2027** intake, please register for Winter 2027 courses. Your steam time work term will take place in Summer or Fall 2027.

The number of credits required to reach Full Time status can vary based on the total number of credits in the year of study of your program.

- Students can only be Part Time in Spring in most programs.

Graduation Requirements: Pass mark of 65% in each course is required to be eligible for program certification and to write ABSA exams. Steam time and work terms are graded pass/fail.

Please note: Power Engineering 4th Class and 3rd Class are different programs, and continuing from 4th to 3rd is NOT automatic. **If you are planning to continue directly from 4th Class to 3rd Class, you must apply for 3rd Class** via www.applyalberta.ca, and you must accept your offered seat and pay the admission deposit before you can register for 3rd class courses.

You may reduce your course load and do fewer courses per term, but it will take you longer than four terms to graduate and you will incur additional costs.

Repeating Courses: Please review the [repeating courses policy](#), as there is a limit to the number of times you can repeat courses.

Once you have registered for classes, **you are responsible for the associated tuition and fees whether you attend or not**, unless you have withdrawn.

PLEASE NOTE: **Non-attendance is not accepted as a notice of withdrawal.**
