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## Program of Study: Practical Nurse Diploma

This diploma program consists of four 4-month terms, plus one six-week-long term after Year 1 for the Continuing Care practicum. To graduate at the end of these terms, students must successfully complete all courses listed for each term (also known as Full Load).

Note that you must successfully complete ALL Year 1 courses before you can take any Year 2 courses.

**Transferability:** For information on transfer to various post-secondary institutions, please refer to the Alberta Transfer Guide at [transferalberta.alberta.ca](https://transferalberta.alberta.ca). Note that every institution has its own policy regarding minimum grades needed for transfer credit.

Based on the number of credits required in an academic year, the number of credits required to reach Full Time (FT) status can vary.

- The six-week Spring term at the end of Year 1 is designated for your first Practicum.

**You may reduce your course load and do fewer courses per term, but it will take you longer than four terms to graduate and you will incur additional costs.**
