Student Advisors will register students in **greyed-out** courses at the direction of the program chair.

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Multi-Part Courses are indicated with a red + on the program of study table. If your course includes a lecture, laboratory, tutorial, clinical, or practicum, please register for ALL required parts, and choose matching section codes.

For example:

- BUS111 lecture A **and** laboratory AL1
- CHEM101 lecture A, laboratory X, **and** tutorial V
- CHEM101 lecture B, laboratory Y, **and** tutorial V2

The number of credits required to reach Full Time status can vary based on the total number of credits in the year of study of your program.

- Students can only be Part Time in Spring in most programs.

Graduation Requirements: Students with a passing grade in each course, who successfully complete the program of study and obtain an overall program Grade Point Average (GPA) of 1.7 or better shall be issued a credential. **Too many grades of D may impact your eligibility to graduate.**

You may reduce your course load and do fewer courses per term, but it will take you longer than four terms to graduate and you will incur additional costs.

Repeating Courses: Please review the [repeating courses policy](#), as there is a limit to the number of times you can repeat courses.

Year 1 consists of two 4-month terms and one 6-week term. **Students will register via Self Service.**

Year 2 consists of two 4-month terms and one 6-week term. **Students will register via self service, but Advisors will add labs and clinicals at the direction of the program chair (greyed out on table).**

Year 3 consists of two 4-month terms. **Advisors will register students at the direction of the program chair (greyed out on table).**

Year 4, during which you are a student of the University of Alberta while remaining at Keyano College in Fort McMurray, consists of two 4-month terms. **Students will register via U of A Bear Tracks.**

There is a fast-track option, in which students progress in consecutive terms with no breaks. More information will be available once you begin your first-year classes.

Progression Policy:

- A minimum of C+ is required to pass all foundational nursing courses (e.g. NURS 106, NURS 116, NURS 120, NURS 124, NURS 125, MMI 133)
- A minimum of a C- is required to pass all other nursing and non-nursing courses.
- For a yearly promotion, a student must have successfully completed all courses from the previous year, and obtain a minimum GPA of 2.0.
- Students with a semester GPA of 1.7 to 1.99 will be placed on academic probation for one semester.
- A student with a GPA of 1.69 or lower must withdraw from the program.
- If the GPA warrants a second academic probation within the program, the student will be required to withdraw from the program and will not be readmitted into the program.
- Readmission to the program is subject to departmental review by the Chair and Dean of the program, in alignment with College Policies.
- Students who fail a second clinical course or a clinical course for the second time will be required to withdraw from the program and will not be readmitted

Not coming to Keyano after all?

Once you have registered for classes, **you are responsible for the associated tuition and fees whether you attend or not**, unless you have withdrawn.

PLEASE NOTE: **Non-attendance is not accepted as a notice of withdrawal.**

Students who voluntarily withdraw from the College must submit a [Withdrawal Form](#) (either signed or sent from your keyanomail account) by a specific date for each term.
